PERCENTAGE OF DOGS WITH EYE ISSUES

PERCENTAGE OF DOGS WITH CATARACTS

PERCENTAGE OF DOGS WITH TEAR STAINS

All dogs have some porphyrin in their tears, but some dogs have more porphyrin and the staining is always more noticeable in white or light-colored dogs. Bulldog, Boxer, Lhasa Apso, Pekingese, Pugs, Bull Mastiff, Boston Terrier, Shih Tzu, Maltese. Dog breeds with flat faces (or short distances between their eyes and nose) are particularly prone to tear staining because of the way their eyes have developed over time.

WHAT AGE SHOULD TREATMENT BEGIN FOR DOGS

It is recommended to begin supplement nutrition by 6 months of age for optimal support. Of course, there are special diets that contain many good nutrients and antioxidants and supplements may not be necessary.
